## THEN LOOK FOR THE MOST LIKELY CANDIDATES IN POST-CIVIL WAR RECORDS CREATED ABOUT THE WAR'S VETERANS.

In 1890, the U.S. government filled out a special census schedule that included veterans of the Civil War or spouses, if the veteran was deceased. Use the information from censuses to see if your ancestor, his siblings, or a widowed spouse is included in the [1890 Veterans Schedule](#). Look for surprises, too – a soldier who deserted his wife may be listed as deceased in this schedule or a veteran may be listed with both a birth name and alias.
